A Cusop charity?

In recent months the Parish Council has been thinking about ways of helping people in the parish. The Council sets aside funds each year for donations, but these can go only to groups, not to individuals. But charities can help individuals. Locally the North Weir Trust already does a good job, providing help to people who live within ten miles of Hay Town Clock. This includes Cusop, but is there a case for an extra charity just for Cusop residents? The Council might be able to provide funds towards it, but it would be up to volunteers to set it up and run it. Cusop Parish Development Plan

We reported in the last newsletter that the Cusop Plan was 'on hold' until the future of the new Herefordshire county plan was more certain. This has now been resolved. The county plan - or "Core Strategy" as it is officially called - was finally adopted by Herefordshire Council in October, so the steering group can get going again with the Cusop Plan. Fortunately there have been no changes to the Herefordshire plan that significantly affect the content of the Cusop Plan, so its content, based on consultation with residents over the past two years, should be much as we envisaged. A draft plan should be ready early in the New Year and it will be available for all residents to comment on before it is finalised. It then goes forward for examination by an independent examiner and finally a referendum of all electors in the parish. Further information from the Clerk (details overleaf).

Wanted - Parish Tree Warden

A county-wide network for tree wardens has been revived and is offering training and support. The parish tree warden is a volunteer role, acting as 'eyes and ears' for the trees of the parish, encouraging good care and appreciation, especially of any veterans, and planting for the next generation. In Cusop we have been lucky to have had land management expert Phil Ferguson as warden for many years, but the new network and its training offers the chance to hand over to someone new. The last few months have been very busy at Cusop Church. As well as our usual services, we held our popular Wartime Teas and a well-attended Harvest Festival where the £173.15 collection was sent to Hegongo Girls' School, Tanzania, to help with the installation of solar panels. At the service we also thanked David Williams for his work as a dedicated Church Warden for over twenty years. In early October the builders arrived and they are making good progress; the rotting wooden floor has been removed and a new oak floor will be laid so that the back of the church will be levelled with the aisle and the porch. The fluorescent lights have been dismantled and replaced by spot lights which light up the beauty of our church including the 14th century roof.
