Bin collections over Christmas.

Herefordshire Council have issued a revised timetable for the collection of bins during the Christmas holiday period.

If your normal collection day is Tuesday 25 Dec it has been changed to Saturday 22 Dec, collections which were scheduled for Wednesday 26 Dec will be made on Saturday 29 Dec and collections for Tuesday 1 Jan 2019 will be made on Saturday 5 Jan 2019.

For household recycling and rubbish collections, please put your bin out by 6.30 a.m. on your collection day, or the night before, throughout the festive period.

Household Recycling Centres will be closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year Day but open as usual on all other days. Details of opening times can be found on Herefordshire Council website.

Grit bins (advice from Herefordshire Council).

Salt from council grit bins can be used on public roads, pavements, and footways. Salt from council grit bins cannot be used for treating private property such as driveways, this misuse of resource can result in a shortage elsewhere which may result in causing a danger to pedestrians and road users. Where conditions are safe to do so grit salt can be spread using shovels to apply a thin and even layer across roads and footways. Please always be aware of approaching vehicles and slippery conditions underfoot. We encourage residents to clear areas outside their properties and where possible to help those less able. Clearance of snow and ice does not make you liable for any incident that may occur.

Lengthsman.

Booker's Edge Development Section 106 Monies.

The Council is in discussion with Herefordshire County Council about how to use the share of the S106 money which is available to the parish for the benefit of the parish and parishioners.

Green re-cycling sacks.

Herefordshire Council will only collect green waste if it is put into green re-cycling sacks which are available from them. Hay & Brecon Farmers are going to become an agent for the supply of these bags.

The risks of overhanging trees.

The weather this summer has encouraged the growth of greenery, so it is a good time to think about the risks of trees on your property near to public roads, or indeed to anyone else's property. Trees, and other plants including roadside boundary hedges, remain the owner's responsibility even where they overhang a road, and if they cause any damage or injury, e.g. by toppling or shedding a limb, the owner will probably be liable. So it would be a good idea to check the condition of any trees near your boundary and take action if they could be dangerous or a nuisance.

Herefordshire Council and the Parish Council have the power to cut back any growth overhanging the highway boundary and will do so if it is a problem (you may then be charged). The usual rule is that there should be clearance of at least 7 ft above footways and 17 ft (roughly the height of telegraph poles) above roadways. The material cut back remains the property of the plant's owner and will be placed inside the owner's boundary.
