New 20mph Speed Limit for Hay

In 2023, a 20mph speed limit is to be introduced throughout Hay, and it could extend a short distance into Cusop by agreement with Herefordshire Council. So it could extend some way up Newport Street and Hardwicke Road (possibly including side roads such as the lower Dingle and Nantyglasdwr Lane.
