The risks of overhanging trees.

The weather this summer has encouraged the growth of greenery, so it is a good time to think about the risks of trees on your property near to public roads, or indeed to anyone else's property. Trees, and other plants including roadside boundary hedges, remain the owner's responsibility even where they overhang a road, and if they cause any damage or injury, e.g. by toppling or shedding a limb, the owner will probably be liable. So it would be a good idea to check the condition of any trees near your boundary and take action if they could be dangerous or a nuisance.

Herefordshire Council and the Parish Council have the power to cut back any growth overhanging the highway boundary and will do so if it is a problem (you may then be charged). The usual rule is that there should be clearance of at least 7 ft. above footways and 17 ft. (roughly the height of telegraph poles) above roadways. The material cut back remains the property of the plant's owner and will be placed inside the owner's boundary.

Salvation Army Clothing Bank.

A clothing bank has been installed at Cusop Village Hall to take clothing and shoes for re-cycling. Don't put your old or unwanted clothes and shoes into landfill where they will produce a range of greenhouse gases while biodegrading, put them in the clothing bank to raise money for the Village Hall and help the Salvation Army to support projects throughout the country.

- An estimated £140 million worth (350,000 tonnes) of used clothing goes to waste in landfill every year
- For every tonne of textiles reused rather than sent into landfill, carbon dioxide emissions a major cause of global warming are reduced by 7 tonnes
- Extending the average life of clothes by nine months would save £5 billion in resources used to supply, launder and dispose of clothing

If it is full, please don't leave your donation beside the bank but ring the number provided on the side of the bank so that it can be emptied.
